



Nunobiki Waterfall

The highest of the waterfalls on this route. It's named Nunobiki (cloth stretched out for drying) because after a heavy rain it looks like a white cloth is hanging over the rock face.



Tsurigane Rock

This stone looks like a bell. They say that when the overhanging rock falls, this world will come to an end.



New Waterfall

A new waterfall emerged after a typhoon in 2011. Especially after strong rain, you can see heavy downfall.



Hisetsu Waterfall

Like snow falling heavily and dancing in the wind, this view is the highlight of the Kumano River. It was named by a local lord. There is now a small park and a camp ground.



Aoi Waterfall

This waterfall is named after the emblem of Tokugawa family, 'Aoi'. The image of water flowing rapidly down the sheer rock face into the Kumano River is truly splendid.



OHiru Island

The gods of this area often had a lunch here and played board games. If you stand on the island, you can see crisscrossing lines that make up what seems to be a game board.



4 Senjigaeri

A perilous point of the journey. This route was so hard to pass, that the messenger of ex-emperor sometimes returned and even the experienced nuns had difficult time to pass this point.



Chihoga-Mine Peak

This peak is called Chihoga-Mine. At its foot is Hayatama Shrine and Kamikura Shrine is halfway up the mountain. The top (253m) commands a wonderful view of the mouth of Kumano River and the ocean beyond.



6 Nabiki Rock

The rock looks as if this is flattering in the wind. This is a typical geological character called "Joint" in the Kumano mountain region.



Tatami Rock

The rock formation looks like tatami mats piled up and leaning to the right. This geological construction is as same as Nabiki Rock "Joint."



6 Hone Island

Legend has it that an evil demon who lived here was struck down by the gods of this region. Here his severed spine remains.



Mifune Island

It is told that the local deities had first appeared here. The culmination of the autumn festival at Hayatama Shrine is a boat race. The boats from different neighborhoods of Shingu City row upstream to this island and circle it three times as a reenactment of the deities appearance.
