

Located in the center of Shingu, this entire island, which has rare ferns and aquatic plants, floats on a pond. A national treasure.






Jofuku Park

About 2,200 years ago, Jofuku came to Shingu in search of an elixir of life by the order of the first Qin Emperor of China. Jofuku taught echniques of whaling, farming, paper making, etc.
